We will continue our journey to become better writers through daily handwriting and phonics lessons, learning how to write the letters we need to represent the sounds we hear. As writers we will practice writing, writing sentences including conjunctions. We will be writing about pirates and finding out information about them. Looking at non-fiction books.



Mathematics

As mathematicians we will be developing our number recognition and reasoning, beginning to estimate how many up to 20 and counting carefully to check. We will develop calculation skills, counting on to find out how many there are altogether and taking away practically. We will also be looking at the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and also doubling and halving.

Expressive arts and Designs

As Artists we will continue to develop our techniques using a range of media. We will produce a variety of artwork, developing skills such as painting, collage and model making. We will be using different musical instruments to explore the sounds they make and to fit in with our topic.

Physical Development

In PE we will continue to think about routines for changing into our PE clothes and back again into our school uniforms. In the hall, we will develop ball skills such as rolling, kicking, throwing and catching.

British Values

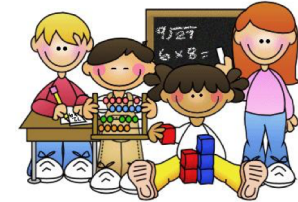
As responsible citizens, we will be developing an increased awareness of respect for others and ourselves. We aim to take more pride in ourselves, our work and our school.
